A Message from the Superintendent:

We recently completed the commencement activities for the forty-five 2010 graduates. This was one of my most memorable graduations. I appreciate the respect and tradition our District has toward graduation. Thank you for attending and helping us celebrate the accomplishments of this year's class.

We were notified by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) that we would be receiving \$2,249,118 in interest-free bonds through the Qualified School Construction Bond (QSCB) Program. This means that 37.4% of our \$6 million bond project approved by the North Platte R-I voters will be interest-free. This was one major decision in moving forward with the construction of the new Intermediate building in Edgerton.

The bids for the new Intermediate building have been approved by the Board of Education. There are still a couple of

bid packages we will need to finalize. It is our goal to begin the excavating within the next couple of weeks, weather permitting. Although the duration of construction has not been finalized we are anticipating a late spring 2011 completion. The building design can be viewed on our website at www.nppanthers.org.

I want to apologize for the delay on deciding if we were going to host a summer school program this year. There were several bills proposed by the state legislature that would have stifled a successful summer school, if approved. None of these bills were approved, thus allowing us to host a summer school much like we have in the past. We appreciate all the families that are sending their children to our summer session.

One project our certified staff has been participating in this year was *Professional Learning Communities*. Our goal of PLC is to increase student learning by looking at stu-



dent assessment, learning styles, and establish learner outcomes. This has been accomplished by creating a collaborative culture. The staff created and Board approved the following mission statement: *North Platte R-I is dedicated to empowering all individuals to successfully meet tomorrow's challenges.*

The North Platte R-I School District has been very fortunate to receive grants made available by the dedicated half-cent sales tax to fund maintenance and improvement of the County Parks system. This summer we will be extending Panther Park at the Elementary with new swings. This 2nd phase project would not be possible without the Parks and Recreation money. Also, the parking lot at Dean Park was chip sealed utilizing park grant money.
